Council Member Emma Martin seconded, resulting in a unanimous vote. 43 44 5. Presentations. 45 Presentation to City Council by members of the Public. (To be conducted as close to 6:05 46 p.m. as possible with a three-minute limit per person. Public Comments will cease at 6:20 47 p.m. This period is reserved for citizens to discuss items not on the listed agenda. The 48 response to Public Comments will be limited to: 1) a statement of fact or policy; 2) Direction 49 to take up the issue with a city staff member; 3) An offer to place the item on a future 50 Council Agenda. 51 52 Dr. Bob Johnson came forward and informed Council and the public that there were free services 53 offered for tax preparation in Greenville at the Public Library and in Sulphur Springs at the 54 Wesley United Methodist Church. He added that this was a service of the American Association 55 of Retired Persons and was for people who could not otherwise pay someone to figure income 56 taxes for them.

Presentation by City Council Members and City Staff: There were none. 7. **Presentation of Animal Shelter Policies:** Animal Shelter Advisory Board Chairman Beckey Thompson made a short presentation over the policies that the board had created for the Animal Shelter. 8. Public Hearing and Consideration of a Conditional Use Permit for the property located at 10 907 Main Street for use as an Online Auction House within the Corridor District: 11 Interim Community Development Director Mike Wiblin explained the location of the building and 12 stated that Mark Malloy had approached them about using it for an Online Auction House. He 13 added that it was taken before the Planning & Zoning Commission on February 5, 2016 and they 14 had approved the request unanimously. 15 16 Mayor Pro Tem Richard Hill opened the public hearing at 6:09 p.m., seeing no one come forward 17 to speak for or against the Conditional Use Permit, Mr. Hill closed the public hearing. Council 18 Member Jean Klaus made the motion to authorize the Conditional Use Permit for the property 19 located at 907 Main for use as an Online Auction House. Council Member Gene Lockhart 20 seconded the motion, resulting in a unanimous vote. 21 22 9. Public Hearing and Consideration of a Conditional/Special Use Permit for the property 23 located at 1509 Live Oak Street for use as a Tire and Service Shop: 24 Interim Director of Community Development Mike Wiblin stated that this item had gone before 25 the Planning and Zoning Commission and they had unanimously voted not to approve the 26 Conditional/Special Use Permit. 27 28 Mayor Pro Tem Richard Hill opened the public hearing at 6:15 p.m. Billy Mabry, owner of the 29 proposed Tire and Service Shop came forward and presented the Council with his ideas to conceal 30 the tires and keeping the property clean. With no one else coming forward to speak for or against, 31 Mayor Pro Tem Hill closed the public hearing at 6:17 p.m. 32 33 Council Member Jean Klaus made the motion to deny the Conditional/Special Use Permit for the 34 property located at 1509 Live Oak, Council Member Gene Lockhart seconded the motion. The 35 vote was 3 - 1, with Council Member Emma Martin voting against the motion to deny. 36 37 10. Consideration of Resolution authorizing signors at Alliance Bank: 38 City Manager Marc Clayton stated that this was just a formality to add Interim City Manager Ned 39 Muse to the list of authorized signors. 40 41 Council Member Emma Martin made the motion to add Mr. Muse as an authorized signor at 42 Alliance Bank. Council Member Jean Klaus seconded the motion, resulting in a unanimous vote. 43 44 11. Consideration of Resolution calling the May 7, 2016 Bond Election: 45 City Manager Marc Clayton stated that during the budget process, the Library Board had come to 46 the Council and talked about how the building could be maintained. The Council had indicated 47 that they wanted to consider a bond election during the next election process. He added that Bond 48 Counsel had put together some figures and they were looking to go out for bonds in the amount of 49 \$500,000.00 for improvements to the library. Mayor Pro Tem Richard Hill asked if there was any 50 member of the Library Board in the audience. Mr. Hill stated that he was a little disappointed to 51 see that no one from the Library Board was present. 52 53 Council Member Jean Klaus asked City Manager Marc Clayton how much money the City gave to 54 the Library every year. Mr. Clayton responded that the total contribution, including some cash and 55 paying most of their bills and all of their utilities, was approximately \$80,000 a year. 56

Council Member Gene Lockhart then made the motion to deny putting the bond election on the May 7, 2016 ballot for voter's to consider. Council Member Jean Klaus seconded the motion, resulting in a unanimous vote.

City Manager Marc Clayton stated that there were 3 places up for election: Mayor, Place 2 and Place 4 and the attached ordinance would officially call the May 7, 2016 election.

Council Member Emma Martin made the motion to adopt the ordinance calling the May 7, 2016 Election. Council Member Jean Klaus seconded the motion, resulting in a unanimous vote.

# 13. Consideration of Ordinance calling a Special Election for the adoption or rejection on ten proposed amendments to the City Charter of the City of Commerce:

City Manager Marc Clayton stated that Jason Cunningham, Chairman of the Charter Review Committee, had presented the proposed amendment changes to the Council at the last meeting. Mr. Clayton continued that approving this ordinance would officially put the proposed changes on the May ballot for the voter's to decide.

Council Member Gene Lockhart made the motion to adopt the ordinance calling the Special Election. Council Member Jean Klaus seconded the motion, resulting in a unanimous vote.
